Using Mindful Mentoring to Support Novice Teachers

PURPOSE: This course prepares mentors to use a mentoring curriculum that ensures mentoring conversations are focused and purposeful.

The goals of this course are to:

- prepare qualified mentors to support novice teachers.
- **support** mentors and novices in having purposeful mentoring conversations aligned to standards.
- **provide** relevant professional learning that can be applied in the classroom
- *inspire* novice teachers to lead their own development through mentoring conversations
- retain novice teachers in our schools.

REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Purchasing paperback (not e-books) copies of the mentoring curriculum -- two books: Mentoring in Action: Guiding, Sharing, and Reflecting With Novice Teachers
 The First Years Matter: Becoming an Effective Teacher 2nd edition Corwin Press.
- 2. Schedule a 30 minute phone appointment with your online mentor.
- 3. Complete all the activities listed in the Professional Learning course.
- 4. Write reflections in the journal and submit your responses to your online mentor.
- 5. Download the certificate of completion and file it.

COST: \$250 includes*; 1 graduate credit, 15 PDPs, one phone appointment with an online mentor, reading of the journal reflections by the online mentor, and verification of course completion with a Gordon College grade report mailed to the teacher's home. A formal transcript from Gordon College MAY be requested by email if needed. * additional fees may apply to online registration
